
The Wolf Wilder:

| Lapushka | A term of endearment. An old, Russian word that means 'sweetheart' or 'darling' |
| Aristocrat | A member of a rich and powerful family |
| Agitator | A person who urges others to protest or rebel. They act against the Tsar |
| Roubles | Currency in Russia |
| Tsar | Emperor of Russia |
| Chyort | An exclamation. Usually means 'damn.' |
| Shashlyk | Kebabs of meat |
| Cherniy | Dark-haired/black (referring to the wolf) |
| Үра | Elated expression- 'hooray'/'hoorah' |

Plot summary:

In 20th-century tsarist Russia, aristocrats raise captured wolf pups to perform as dogs, but when the wolves go mad, they send them to a girl named Feo and her mother, Marina, who "untame" them, so they may live in the wintry wild again. When the corrupt Russian Army threatens her wolves and arrests her mum, Feo is left with no option but to go on the run.

| Grey, Black & White, Tenderfoot | Wolves that Feo has 'untamed.' |
| Alexei | A revolutionary agitator who believes that Feo's bravery can be used to inspire others to join his cause. |
